When you first hear your loved one has been diagnosed with advanced prostate cancer (APC), the news can be devastating. You may wonder how to approach him, what the first important steps should be, and how to move forward from here. This guide provides some suggestions and advice on how to support your loved one during his diagnosis and treatment.

Although now is a time when everyone is dedicated to and focused on his needs, this is also a time when you may need support, too. If you don't feel you can talk to the team treating your loved one, try talking with your own doctor. It's just as important to take care of yourself. The better you feel, the more you can take care of him and the more you can do to help him.

Important Safety Information (continued)

Serious allergic reactions. Get medical help right away if you get any of these symptoms:

- Trouble breathing or wheezing
- Severe itching
- Swelling of your face, lips, mouth, or tongue

Disorders of the heart's electrical activity. Your healthcare provider may do tests during treatment with FIRMAGON to check your heart for a condition called long QT syndrome.



Support from the beginning

You may find it useful to learn some basic facts about APC. Understanding the disease more will help with the decisions you will need to make together in the future.

- Growth and function of the prostate gland depend on testosterone (**T**), a male hormone (or androgen) made mainly in the testicles¹
- Testosterone is a hormone that can stimulate prostate cancer growth¹
- Cancer of the prostate gland develops when cells of the prostate show uncontrolled growth—frequently fueled by high levels of testosterone¹
- The goal of androgen deprivation therapy (ADT) is to stop the production or effects of testosterone in prostate cancer, which should then lower prostate-specific antigen (PSA) levels²
- FIRMAGON starts lowering **T** from Day 1^{3,4}



Important Safety Information (continued)

- Before receiving FIRMAGON, tell your healthcare provider about all your medical conditions, including if you have any heart problems including a condition called long QT syndrome, have problems with blood levels such as sodium, potassium, calcium, and magnesium, have kidney or liver problems.



Starting treatment with FIRMAGON³

There are important facts to know about FIRMAGON, the therapy his treatment team, including himself, has chosen.

- FIRMAGON is an ADT—also called a gonadotropin-releasing hormone (GnRH) antagonist⁴
- FIRMAGON is a hormone therapy that works to stop **T** at its main source starting on day 1 (the day he started therapy)⁴

It's more than an appointment, it's an opportunity

FIRMAGON is a therapy that's given in the doctor's office—just once a month—with an injection below the skin of the abdomen.⁴ This once-monthly FIRMAGON schedule offers a great opportunity for you to connect with his treatment team. One way you can encourage this relationship is by keeping track of monthly appointment dates.

Write down all questions regarding his general health, specific questions about his APC, or any other questions you may have, and bring these with you to the doctor's office. The treatment journal in the patient brochure will help you keep your questions and answers to those questions organized and up-to-date.

Quality counts! It's part of your doctor's job to make sure you are satisfied with your quality of care.

Important Safety Information (continued)

- The common side effects of FIRMAGON include: hot flashes, injection site pain, redness and swelling, weight loss or gain, increase in some liver enzymes, decreased sex drive, and erectile function problems.

6 STEPS TO CAREGIVING

Caregivers play an important role before, during, and after treatment. Here are a few helpful tips to get you started.



1. Be open

A prostate cancer diagnosis brings many emotions. Be open to emotions and feelings. If he can't or won't share his feelings with you, remind him that talking with someone will help.



2. Take care of yourself

Balancing caregiving with other daily chores can be challenging. Know your own limitations and don't forget to take time to relax and recharge.



3. Think positive

Maintaining a positive attitude can impact everyone around you. Many studies show there is real power in positive thinking.



4. Find out

The more you know, the more empowered you will feel. Come to doctor's appointments with a list of questions and don't leave until you have the answers you need.



5. File it

Treating prostate cancer brings lots of logistics. Organize appointments, medicines, receipts, and insurance information for easy reference and access.



6. Seek help

Feel comfortable reaching out to family, friends, and support groups for help when you need it.
